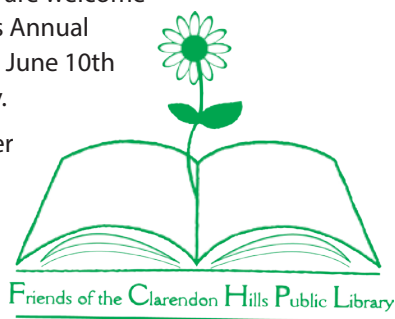
Friends of the Library

Kay Carlson Book Group celebrates 38 years

If you drop into the library on the first Wednesday morning of the month, you probably have noticed the group of ladies in the adult services area having a lively discussion of their latest thought-provoking title.

The "Kay Carlson Book Discussion Group" has been sharing opinions about books since 1975. For its first twenty years the group's discussions were led by Kay Carlson, a retired professor from the University of Illinois at Chicago. After the 1995-96 season, Mrs. Carlson retired as leader, but that didn't stop the group. With some changes in membership, the ever-lively discussions have continued uninterrupted ever since.

This year, for the first time, the group has decided to continue to meet during the summer months, and take their usual hiatus in the winter instead. Like all our discussion groups, new members are always welcomed to the Kay Carlson group. Just drop by on the first Wednesday morning of the month at 10 and join the discussion. 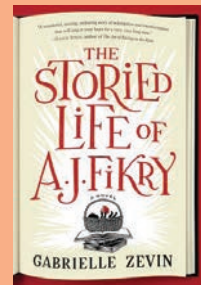

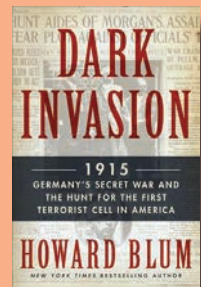

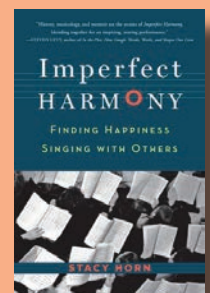
